Forecast Issued: 8:00am April 28th, 2014 **Forecaster:** JH

Day 1 (Tue 4/29): A significant storm system and upper level low in the Central United States will begin shifting northeastward during the day on Tuesday. Scattered showers are expected to develop from southwest to northeast throughout much of the Middle Atlantic states. However, to the northeast of our area, another upper level low will be compressing the flow and making it difficult initially for moisture and lift to stream into our area. The threat for bursts of moderate to heavy rain will likely hold off until very late Tuesday night or early Wednesday.

Day 2 (Wednesday 4/30): An upper level low pressure system begins shifting toward the region and lift for heavy precipitation spreads overhead. A rapid increase in moisture will allow for moderate to heavy rain along this axis of best lift. Steady rain is expected during much of Wednesday. Rising river levels in response to the heavy rain and potential for prolonged/training areas of heavy rain cause concern for river flooding especially in parts of Central and Northern New Jersey. The Hydrometeorological Prediction Center is forecasting Action level river stages on 5+ area rivers.

As a result, we have issued a Moderate Risk for flooding concerns from Wednesday into Thursday morning.

Day 3 (Thursday 5/1): Periods of heavy rain are expected to continue into Thursday morning. Hydrometeorological Prediction Center forecast river stages remain above Action Stage at several area rivers with some rivers in Central New Jersey forecast to reach Moderate Flood Stage. It is recommended, if you live in a flood zone, that you make some preparations just in case. We are not expecting a widespread or life/property threatening situation, but some river flooding is becoming likely.

Rain is forecast to taper off by Thursday afternoon as the best lift and support for heavy precipitation shifts north of the area.
